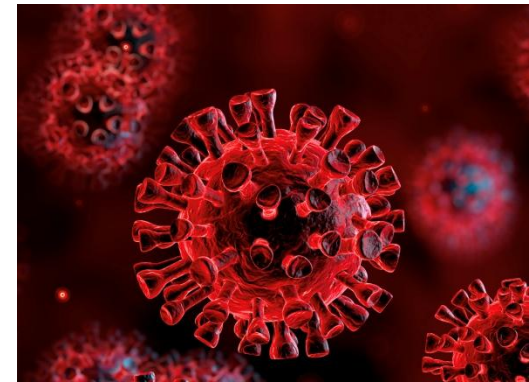

**Discrimination in Housing
is Illegal!
Know your Fair Housing Rights!**

The Coronavirus/COVID -19 pandemic has had a profound impact on all of us. The need for assistance in many areas is greater than ever and many of us have faced difficulties and hardships during this past year.

Unfortunately, some have faced increased discrimination because of the Coronavirus/COVID-19 or a perceived connection to the Coronavirus/COVID-19

If you are a healthcare worker or someone who is now disabled because of COVID-19 or if you have had COVID-19, it is possible that you may experience housing discrimination. Those who have suffered from COVID-19 may now need a reasonable accommodation or modification to use and enjoy their dwelling. Healthcare workers and others may face discrimination based on unfounded fears of contracting and spreading the virus.
